This will enable applications to all further education processes after BNA electronically and allow parents to monitor the full process. As a result of this upgrade, I hope to launch our new data management system, which should make external communications between parents and the school much

better.

The school has managed to attract clubs to operate in the school, however, we need parental consent to be made at the beginning of each term for any external clubs to be paid for. This is required prior to your child being allowed to join the club. Such clubs include: STEM Robotics, Krumps (Dance and Gymnastics), Duke of Edinburgh, NHSMUN.

As I said at the start of the message there is a lot happening in the school and we hope that you and your children have a relaxing midterm break and your children return back to school on time and fully refreshed for the second part of this term.
